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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
INTERNATIONAL BILINGUAL PRIMARY SCHOOL

To: The Recorder of Deeds
Washington, D.C.

We, the undersigned natural persons of the age of twenty-one years or more, acting as incorporators of a corporation adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation pursuant to the District of Columbia Non-profit Corporation Act:

1. The name of the corporation shall be International Bilingual Primary School.
2. The period of its duration is perpetual.
3. The corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes as provided in the pertinent provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 of the United States.

No portion of the corporation's assets or income shall be paid, distributed or in any way inure to the benefit of any private individual, except reasonable compensation for services and reimbursement for expenses; nor shall any part of the activities of the corporation consist of carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, to participate

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in any political campaign or to further any political party or candidate for political office.

In order to carry out the foregoing purposes, the corporation shall have the following powers:

(a) to establish, operate, and maintain a school or schools in order to provide an international and bilingual curriculum for the international community in and around Washington, D.C., or elsewhere, as well as for other persons desirous of obtaining for their children an internationally oriented education.

(b) to promote other educational activities within the limitations prescribed by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended (or under corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), and within such limitations as may be prescribed from time to time by the Regulations of the Internal Revenue Service pursuant to said Section 501(c)(3).

4. The corporation shall have no members.

5. The manner in which the directors are to be elected or appointed shall be provided in the bylaws.

6. Upon dissolution, the assets of the corporation remaining after payment and discharge of all debts and liabilities shall be distributed to one or more exempt organizations, chosen by the directors of the corporation in their absolute discretion, and organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes as provided in the pertinent provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 of the United States.

7. The address, including street and number, of the initial registered office of the corporation is Cleary, Gottlieb, Steen & Hamilton, Suite 400, 1250 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C., and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is Robert C. Zimmer.

8. The number of directors constituting the initial board of directors of the corporation is five, which number may be increased or decreased pursuant to the by-laws of the corporation, but shall not be less than three, and the names and addresses, including street and number, of the persons who are to serve as the initial directors until their successors be elected and qualified are:
